Prayer...

"Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give your rest." (Matthew 11:28).

Prayer takes us in three directions: prayer takes us "inward" as we seek transformation in our lives; "upward" as we seek the intimacy with Jesus we desire; and "outward" as we minister to the needs of others. This month I want to start the journey "upward" as we seek intimacy with Jesus through the prayers of adoration and rest.

Adoration implies selfless devotion, is spontaneous, and is expressed with a heart of worship, respect and honor to God. There are no petitions, desires, requests, but only expressing the joy of His presence in our lives. The focus is on God and His characteristics or qualities – an intimate time of experiencing Him in a more personal way. A time where He expresses Himself to us.

There are two sides to the Prayer of Adoration: thanksgiving and praise. To quote Richard Foster: "in thanksgiving we give glory to God for what he has done for us; in praise we give glory to God for who he is in himself." Praise transcends thanksgiving. In thanksgiving we are still aware of our needs, desires, and for direction in our lives – for in thanksgiving we express gratitude of how our prayers have been answered and our needs met. In praise, we turn totally away from ourselves to focus on God's love, grace, and redemption. P.T. Forsyth wrote that "the dialogue of grace is really the monologue of the divine nature in self-communing love."

What are the obstacles to adoration in our lives? They include the demands of everyday living; being drawn into analyzing a situation in our lives rather than just contemplating on its significance and meaning in our lives; and our materialistic culture where we are focused on what we need next in life rather than celebrating and enjoying what we have today. We need to experience pleasures in life rather than merely scrutinize them.

Adoration helps us to find or see that place of rest when at times in life we feel surrounded by chaos and confusion or fears of what lies ahead of us in life. As we progress from thanksgiving; praise, and adoration – we find a place of rest for body, mind, and spirit.

Rest is critical to a healthy spiritual life – the "resting of God" on the seventh day became the theological framework for the concept of the Sabbath – one that so often is not recognized or practiced in today's society. Richard Foster says that "no teaching flowing out of the Sabbath principle is more important than the centrality of our resting in God." The Sabbath rest does not promote or imply inactivity; rather it is the placing of our lives in divine hands and responding to the promptings of the Spirit. It is not total passivity found in some Eastern faiths such as Hinduism where one resides passively in the impersonal and fated will of the transcendent. Prayer leads us to a middle ground where we are not actively pursuing our desires with God or passively seeking God to control our lives - but instead seeking to reach a middle ground where we are on a journey shared with God. The devotional masters used the term Otium Sacntum, "holy leisure." It is striving to find a balance in life related to: activity and rest, work and play, sunshine and rain. It means to go about our daily activities in life in the presence of God.

The Holy Spirit of God accompanies us in our prayers (Romans 8:26-27) [26 ...the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express. 27 And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints in accordance with God's will.] Jesus Christ is our High Priest and serves as the High Priest did in ancient Israel – interceding before God on behalf of His people.

What can we do? We can seek or prayerfully cultivate a life of reflection, nourished by solitude, silence, and rest – and gently enter into the Holy of Holies – intimacy with Jesus.


