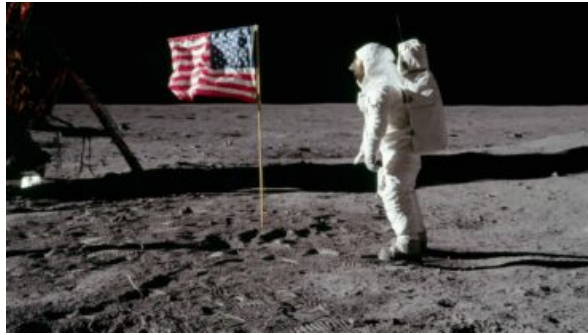

Creation Moments -

The Pursuit of Technology

Genesis 1:28

“And God blessed them, and God said unto them, Be fruitful, and multiply, and replenish the earth, and subdue it: and have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the fowl of the air, and over every living thing that moveth upon the earth.”

If my mother were still alive, she would have been a hundred years old this year, as I write this script. One of her favorite things as a child was to look at the Moon. She was sure she could see a man’s face on its surface. But in later years, she told me she didn’t like the Moon anymore.

“They’ve spoiled it for me,” she said. “They’ve spoiled it by putting their dirty great footprints all over it.”

So she was not a fan as I was of the Apollo Moon program. While I watched spellbound, as astronauts bounced their way around the craters, she was worried about how taking Moon rock back to Earth was somehow leaving the Moon damaged.

Perhaps there was a tendency among some of that generation to be concerned about the rapid march of progress and technology. And we are well aware today that not every technological achievement has been beneficial to mankind.

But God gave humanity the so-called Cultural Mandate, in Genesis 1:28. We are to “fill the earth and subdue it.” This subduing of the earth requires the development of technology – some of which is described in Genesis 4:20-22, with the first husbandry, musician and metalsmith. While we must always be cognizant of the impact of our technology on the environment, we are, after all, supposed to be stewards of this planet. The forward march of technology is a good thing, even if it does leave dirty great footprints all over the Moon!

Prayer: Thank You, Lord, that You have given people talents and abilities in all sorts of areas of expertise – especially thinking of those whose work in technology and science pushes back the frontiers of human abilities. Amen.

Easter and The Wondrous Love of God

This Sunday celebrates the most amazing and hopeful moment in human history. For Christians around the world, this is the time of year when we are reminded of the deep mystery of God's love for each and every one of us. From Holy Thursday's remembrance of the Lord's Supper to Good Friday's Passion of Jesus Christ to Easter Sunday's glorious celebration of the Resurrection, we are invited anew to consider the meaning for our own lives of God sending His one and only Son into the world to suffer, die, and be raised from the dead. This is not merely a vague observance. This is not simply a remembrance of a historic act two millennia ago. This is a day which is about hope and salvation for each of us. The events of Holy Week probe the deepest nature of God's wondrous love for humanity – even if we cannot fully understand or explain it.

Three events, in particular, are powerful signs that God's love stands in stark contrast to the normal ways of the world.

During the Last Supper, Jesus tells his disciples, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another" (John 13:34). Because Jesus had just washed the feet of the disciples, it was clear that the love he was describing was one that joyfully served the needs of others with humility.

On Good Friday, as Roman soldiers nailed him to the cross "Jesus said, 'Father, forgive them, they know not what they do'" (Luke 23:34). Each of us can appeal to God for forgiveness. We all stand in the shadow of the cross. That God's only Son willingly accepted death on the cross so that we may have eternal life with Him in heaven is an astounding act of self-sacrificing love that confounds all understanding. Yet, it is this same extraordinary love that Christ called his disciples to have for one another. And because Christ was truly human as well as truly God, his sacrifice on the cross shows what great love of which men and women are capable.

Finally, Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday reveals that God's self-sacrificing love conquers even death itself. The reaction of his followers as they discovered the empty tomb – and then as he appeared to the disciples – led to such an explosion of dedicated eye witnesses and missionaries that Christianity spread with extraordinary speed across the Mediterranean and all the way to India. The next time you see a picture of Saint Peter's Basilica remember that it is built on the grave of Saint Peter, the spot of his own crucifixion. In the years following Christ's resurrection, he and Saint Paul traveled and spoke throughout the Roman world. In a short amount of time, Christianity had reached the heart of the greatest empire the West has known. In fact, Christianity had spread so fast that the empire felt threatened by it and tried to kill its leaders. As you watch Pope Francis at Easter Mass in front of thousands, it will be clear the Roman Empire lost the competition for loyalty.

Today, Christianity is practiced in many rites — Catholic-Orthodox-Protestant – but among Christians of every denomination, Easter plays a major role. It is no wonder that after the resurrected Jesus called on his followers to make disciples of all nations by baptizing them and teaching them to obey all that Jesus had commanded, that the world was gradually and radically transformed (see Matthew 28:19-20).

Over time, men and women would no longer be prey to the strong, but they would be children of a God who loved them. They would be recognized as deserving of God-given rights that no man or government has the authority to take away, such as rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. Eventually, our own country was founded on a basis that explicitly understood the role of government to protect these Creator-endowed rights and to elevate the human condition. In time, Judeo-Christian morality extended these protections to all of our people.

At this time of year, we give thanks for the transforming power of God's love. We honor all those men and women who preach the good news of God's love in the United States. And we pray that the U.S. always remains a place that welcomes and honors God's love.

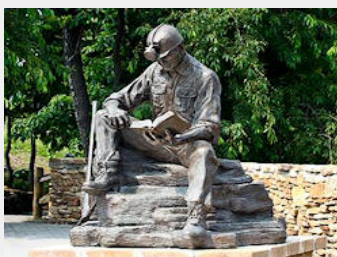

On Tuesday morning, September 11, 2001, the U.S. came under attack when four commercial airliners were hijacked and used to strike targets on the ground. Nearly 3,000 people tragically lost their lives. Because of the actions of the 40 passengers and crew aboard one of the planes, Flight 93, the attack on the U.S. Capitol was thwarted. With the new visitors center this is an emotional experience. This is all free to the public.

Quecreek Mine



We invite you to come visit the rescue site where you can walk right up to the rescue shaft where the miners emerged from the dark, cold mine 240 feet below after 77 hours of frigid darkness. You will be greeted by the 7 foot tall bronze statue of a coal miner at the top of the walkway into the rescue site. Hear the story of the miracle from people personally involved in the rescue. Touch the rescue capsule and try to imagine how it would feel to squeeze into it with your strength nearly gone. This has a \$7.00 fee to enter the visitors center all money is used to expand the center. The Visitors center has a film of the farmer describing the day's events from the first person that was doing surveying on his property to locate the shaft till the end when all 9 were rescued. There are also recorded voices of the miners when they hit water.

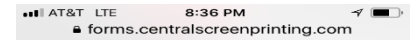
